MINNEHAHA COMMUNITY WATER, CORP. FORTY FOURTH ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING Thursday, May 20th, 2021

Minnehaha Community Water, Corp. held its Forty-Fourth Annual Meeting using a Proxy only Format on the Thursday, May 20, 2021. All members were sent a ballot which registered them to vote; confirmed they were given the annual audit report, approved the minutes from last year, and cast two votes for Mike Cypher, Paul Hentges or Kenny Sieverding.

Quorum of 135 members were present by proxy. There were 125 votes to approve the minutes, 125 votes to approve the audit report, and 106 votes for Kenny Sieverding, 99 votes for Paul Hentges, and 61 votes for Mike Cypher. Kenny Sieverding and Paul Hentges were re-elected to the board.

All Members returning their ballots were given an opportunity to receive a \$50 water bill credit. The winners of the \$50 water bill credits were: Wyn Johnson of Baltic, Stanley Walton of Humboldt, Ken Mader of Colton, Terrence Fleming of Crooks, Roger Willard of Colton, and Tracy Koskela of Sioux Falls.
